#### **Executive Summary**

Perak Motor Co Sdn Bhd (PMC) was strategically located at Batu 12, Jalan Bidor, Teluk Intan which was within the vicinity to manay estates such as United Plantations Seri Pelangi, Moccis, City Plantations and Jasa Budiman. Total work force was around 120 employees. Housing with electricity and water utilities were provided to those workers staying inside the compound.

MSPO Manual (Doc No: 1 Rev 0 dated 1 Sep 2018) was established by Managing Director of Perak Motor Company Sdn Bhd (PMC) who shall be responsible for the maintenance and the distribution of the manual.

This assessment was single site certification as a palm oil mill. Stage 1 audit was performed on 09/11/2018 and total of 11 findings were highlighted during audit on documentation review and site walkabout. All areas of concern were satisfactorily closed by the time of stage 2 audit.

Stage 2 audit was conducted from 25-Jan-2019 to 26-Jan-2019 and improvement was sighted since last visit. However, during audit there were total of 2 nonconformities detected relevant to Employment Condition (Principle 4) and Wastes Management (Principle 5). Refer to MSPO Part 3 Checklist and NCR 1 to 2 of 2.
