Executive Summary

This stage 2 audit assessment was carried out on sampling basis for 200 smallholders within the SPOC Machap / Ulu Benut J6 group. A total of 22 smallholder's had been sampled. The smallholders had indicated their consent to participate in the certification scheme by submitting the borang permohonan pensijilan minyak mampan Malaysia. The MSPO policy was stated in the MSPO Application form. MPOB Good agriculture practices checklist were included in the form. The Smallholders general awareness regarding the objectives and the standard requirement related to MSPO was noted during the interviews carried out during the site visit assessment.

Awareness seminars regarding matters related to MSPO were carried out among the smallholders. Communication and distribution of information regarding new technology or MSPO related matters were extended to the use of media such as whatsapp, giving copies of Warta Sawit and dissemination of leaflets and slide handouts during the MSPO awareness seminar.

Personal information of smallholders was kept in each individual file including the MPOB licenses, samples of records of transactions and receipt purchases of agrochemicals. Noted during site visit assessment the transparent practice of FFB transport from field to mill/FFB collection centre.

A list of legal acts or requirements were established through Senarai Keperluan undang – undang issue no 1 for SPOC J6. Documents assessment and interview sessions carried out noted the awareness of smallholders on importance of legal compliance. All smallholders possess a valid MPOB license permitting their operational activities. On land use right matters, the group management had listed 70 smallholders to be further consulted on the needs of land use rights amendments.

Complaints regarding matters among or related to smallholders are usually managed by the group manager. Borang aduan dan rungutan was established and made available at the MPOB's Office.

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Series of briefings regarding safety was planned and carried out accordingly. Awareness level of workers on safety related issues such as wear of PPE were abundant as per interview sessions carried out. Majority of the field operational works such as harvesting, and manuring were executed by themselves with assistance of other family members or appointed FFB collection centres. The practice of outsourcing labour to collection centres not only diminishes the responsibility of smallholders to provide worker's housing but also addresses the labour shortage issue faced by many of them. Works and rates of pay were agreed prior to execution of work. Sighted the use of Terma penggajian pekerja and ¬syarat mengupah pekerja di kebun kelapa. No child labour was sighted during site visit and document assessment.

Environmental awareness was raised among the smallholders through briefings such as the one held at Dewan Orang Ramai Renggam that was participated by 151 smallholders. Noted the general awareness of smallholders in managing their operational wastes. Documentation assessment sighted Senarai sisa racun dan domestic which identifies the types of waste generated by the smallholders. However, base on site visit assessment, the group manager might consider the needs to enhance control on domestic waste disposal methods.

The existence of rare, threatened and endangered species animals was not available in SPOC Machap/Ulu Benut. In the event of such sightings or human wild life conflict, the smallholders were aware to inform the relevant local authority such as forestry or wildlife department for assistance. Members of SPOC Machap/Ulu Benut were made aware of illegal burning during land preparation. Such practices were not sighted during the site visit assessment.

Smallholders assessed maintained a buku rekod ladang for the purpose of recording monthly sales of FFB. The assessment noted the crop and prices trend for the smallholders. Smallholders site management was based on Good Agriculture Practice guidelines from MPOB. Field boundary markers were available in smallholders with bigger land area. However, smallholders with small plots of land maintained their perimeter boundary by practices of frond stacking or construction of field drains. No land disputes were recorded during the assessment.

No new planting available during assessment.

In general SPOC Machap / Ulu Benut is implementing a management system that is fulfilling the requirement of MSPO standards.

Remarks:

The collection centre has served as a conduit of information between MPOB and the smallholders due to its constant contact with FFB suppliers. To maintain loyalty with its suppliers, the collection centre has to diversify its business activities from merely being a purchaser of FFB to a provider of other essential services that the smallholder requires particularly manpower.

The local headman also performs as a distributor of information being well connected with the government administration but feels the constraint of delivering specific material especially with respect to MSPO.

Both parties acknowledge that the implementation of the certification scheme has brought changes in oil palm plantation management in terms of transparency and observation of safety and health. Other smallholders however have yet to sign up for the scheme.
